Clean Air for Smaller Cities (€ 5.5 mil)



The Project Objective

Small and medium-sized cities are increasingly able to develop and implement measures to improve the air quality

The Indicators

- **Clean Air Plans (action plans) are available for at least 10 cities (200,000 – 1.5 million inhabitants) and**
- **in at least 7 cities the plans are under implementation.**

Indicators will be more specifically defined for each city action plan and monitoring systems will be introduced at city level to follow-up implementation compliance.

Objective Phase I (2009 – 2012)

Selected ports comply with relevant international Safety, Health and Environmental (SHE) standards and conventions.
