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Energy use of Transport Sector

- In OECD countries, transport accounts for 1/3 of total energy demand
- In ASEAN countries, transport is either biggest or second biggest energy consumer
 - Share of transport total final energy demand (2010):
 - Thailand: 34% (industry: 30%)
 - Indonesia: **33%** (industry: 42%)
 - Vietnam: **31%** (industry: 42%)
 - Malaysia: **41%** (industry 30%)
 - Philippines: **37%** (industry: 27%)
 - According to IEA , transport is #1 consumer of fossil fuels in ASEAN

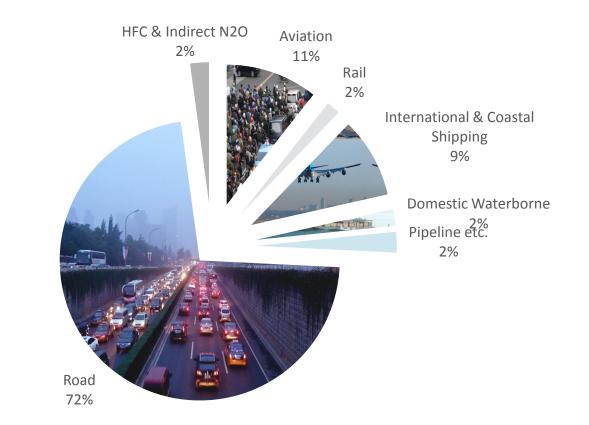

- Potentially broader government buy-in as sector action can be linked to domestic climate change targets in addition to sector policy objectives



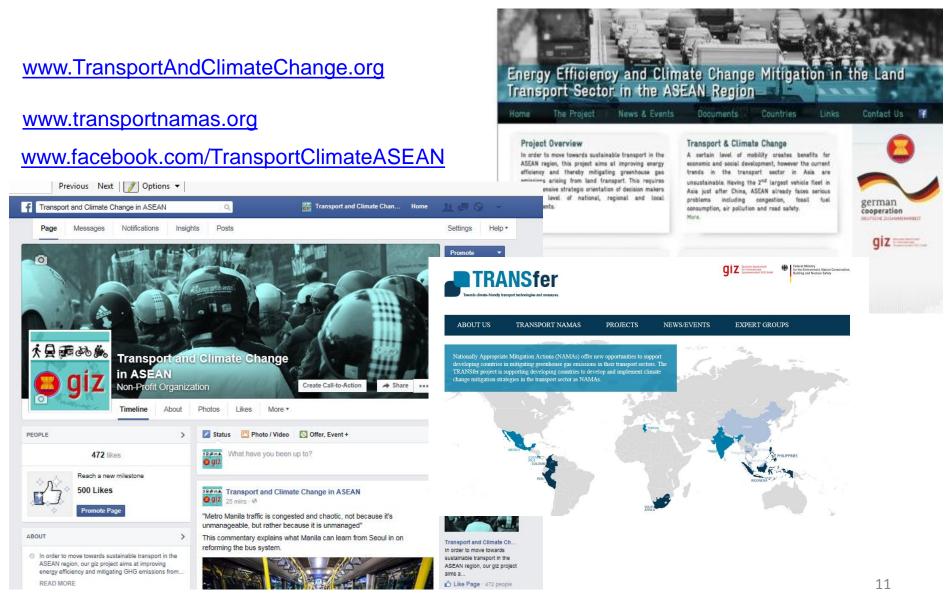
